The Ministry of Education has your transcript or certificate if you attended a B.C. or Yukon secondary school and you:

Transcripts

- Graduated after 1985 or
- Completed a grade 12 course after 1986 or
- Attended grade 12 prior to 1974 in the University Entrance or Academic-Technical Program

Certificates

Graduated in British Columbia after 1985

If the Ministry does not have your transcript or certificate, please contact your school of record or district office.

General Education Development (GED®)

- GED° records from 1973 to 2014 are retained by the Ministry of Education

If you have a Personal Education Number (PEN)

You will need a BCeID to access the StudentTranscripts Service

If you do not have a Personal Education Number (PEN)

You do not have a PEN if you attended a B.C. K-12 school before 1993, or if you never wrote a B.C. provincial exam (introduced in 1986). If you do not have a PEN, you will need to order through the "place an order without a PEN option" on the BC Ministry of Ed web site
