GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eighty credits in Grades 10-12 (equivalent to 20 four-credit courses) are required for graduation.

To graduate, you need at least 48 credits from Required Courses - subjects such as Language Arts, Social Studies and Science.

As well, you need 28 credits from Elective Courses, a four-credit Graduation Transitions and five Graduation Program exams. A minimum of 16 credits at the Grade 12 level are required, including Language Arts 12 (all ministry-authorized and board/authority-approved courses count).
