Summer School 2022

Mission Public Schools is pleased to announce the addition of several summer programs for students in grades 9, 10 and 11. Courses are designed for students who have not successfully completed core academic learning during the regular year. Students can register for a maximum of two courses. Each course is two hours long for a total of 40-hours. The courses will be offered in July at École Mission Senior Secondary.

Course offering includes:

Successful completion of all Summer School courses will result in a passing grade of 50%

Grade 9

- Remedial English 9 (40% during 2021-2022 school year entrance requirement)
- Remedial Math 9 (40% during 2021-2022 school year entrance requirement)

Grade 10

- Remedial English 10 (40% during 2021-2022 school year entrance requirement)
- Remedial Science 10 (40% during 2021-2022 school year entrance requirement)
- Remedial Social Studies 10 (40% during 2021-2022 school year entrance requirement)
- Remedial Foundations Pre-Calculus 10 (40% during 2021-2022 school year entrance requirement)
- Remedial Workplace Math 10 (40% during 2021-2022 school year entrance requirement)

Grade 11

- Remedial English 11 (40% during 2021-2022 school year entrance requirement)

Registration: If you are a student attending Middle School, you will need to register in-person at your corresponding middle school. If you are a student attending Secondary School, you will need to register in-person at École Mission Secondary School.

Fee: Once enrolled, you will receive a link via email to pay a \$50 (refundable upon successful course(s) completion) online at www.schoolcashonline.com

- Connecting students with paid tutors and services
- Placement into special programs such as Learning Assistance
- Providing information about course selection
- Informing students about graduation requirements
